

Salutation and Collect of the Day

"Salutation" is a word from Latin meaning, "to greet." "Collect" (KAH-lekt), a brief structured prayer, usually consisting of five parts: address to God, basis for the prayer, petition, desired benefit or result, and trinitarian conclusion. The Collect of the Day also "collects" the message of the day's Gospel reading.

A The Epistle is from Hebrews, chapter 7.




Holy Gospel

Nicene Creed


Distribution

The Lord Jesus Christ Opens Our Eyes to God and Brings Us into His Presence

As He did for blind Bartimaeus, so does the Lord, Jesus Christ, have mercy upon you. With His Word of the Gospel, "he is calling you" to Himself, to "take heart," to rise up and live by faith in His forgiveness. He opens your heart and mind to see and know God rightly in Him and to follow Him "on the way" of the cross and into life everlasting (Mark 10:49–52). "He is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him," because He is the great High Priest, who offered Himself "once for all" as a sacrifice for sins. Since He is risen from the dead and "exalted above the heavens," He "holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever," and "he always lives to make intercession" for His people (Heb. 7:24–27). Along with that, He gathers the children of God to Himself by the proclamation of His Gospel, even "from the farthest parts of the earth." In mercy He calls them, by the waters of Holy Baptism, "in a straight path in which they shall not stumble," unto life everlasting (Jer. 31:8–9).

The great sacrifice of Jesus upon the cross covers the sins of all mankind. When that sacrifice was made, Jesus proclaimed: "It is finished." No sacrifice of ours is needed to cover our sins. And yet St. Paul tells us to be "living sacrifices," and Jesus tells us to "lay your offering at the altar." So sacrificial giving goes on, but now its purpose is transformed by the one sin-atoning sacrifice of Christ. Now our giving and serving are sacrifices of thanksgiving, gifts of self in serving others for Christ's sake.
