

Salutation and Collect of the Day

"Salutation" is a word from Latin meaning, "to greet." "Collect" (KAH-lekt), a brief structured prayer, usually consisting of five parts: address to God, basis for the prayer, petition, desired benefit or result, and trinitarian conclusion. The Collect of the Day also "collects" the message of the day's Gospel reading.

A The First Reading is from Acts, chapter 5.

¹²Now many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. ¹³None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high esteem. ¹⁴And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, ¹⁵so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. ¹⁶The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.

Epistle

Revelation 1:4-20

⁴John to the seven churches that are in Asia:

To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood ⁶and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. ⁹I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. ¹⁰I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet ¹¹saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea."

¹²Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, ¹³and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. ¹⁴The hairs of his head were white like wool, as white as snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, ¹⁵his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. ¹⁶In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

¹⁷When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, ¹⁸and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. ¹⁹Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this. ²⁰As for the mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands, the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.



Holy Gospel

John 20:19-31

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twentieth chapter.



¹⁹On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."

²⁴Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

²⁶Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

Apostles' Creed

C I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.



Distribution



TLS/CYC Update

The Lutheran School Association of Topeka (LSAT) voted unanimously to transition the Center for Young Children (CYC) Gage to the Roosevelt campus during their meeting on April 7, 2022. The LSAT recognizes the important need that CYC meets for TLS families and for the Topeka community, and the goals for this transition are to ensure its on-going viability and to enhance its partnership with TLS. The financial and enrollment challenges over recent years have been exacerbated with the impact of the COVID pandemic, resulting in a need to streamline operations. This transition not only allows the CYC to operate with a smaller operational footprint it helps to enhance the entire organization.

The Roosevelt CYC will utilize the four classrooms located in the west entrance hall. During operations hours the restrooms in that hall will only be used by CYC students and staff. The plan calls for the CYC Roosevelt to begin operation on Tuesday July 5, 2022. The CYC Gage last day will fall sometime the week before. The LSAT's goal is to ensure that service interruption is minimal.

CYC Roosevelt will be able to serve children from year one (walking) through PreK. The estimated enrollment on the first day of operation at the Roosevelt campus is 43. Some building modifications and updates will be completed prior to the transition including:

- Updating the smoke alarm system in the CYC rooms
- Installing sinks in two of the classrooms
- Expanding the playground to create a toddler playground
- Relocating the current TLS teacher workroom for the CYC Director
- Some painting of rooms and common space
- Relocating equipment, furniture, and other classroom materials from Gage
- Getting all four rooms licensed for operation

The board is looking forward the strengthening of our organization by this transition which will continue to allow the children of our congregations and the Topeka community to hear about Jesus every day and receive quality care.


