Salutation and Collect of the Day

"Salutation" is a word from Latin meaning, "to greet." "Collect" (KAH-lekt), a brief structured prayer, usually consisting of five parts: address to God, basis for the prayer, petition, desired benefit or result, and trinitarian conclusion. The Collect of the Day also "collects" the message of the day's Gospel reading.




Holy Gospel Matthew 22:15–22

Creed comes from the Latin "credo" which means "I believe." We confess our Christian faith in one of the three creeds (short statement of belief) agreed upon by the ancient church.


I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

Mission Update from Schumachers

Just a reminder -- the Schumachers are currently at their home in Indiana, with tentative plans to return to Ghana in January, 2021, if it is safe to do so. The following message goes back to the beginning of this calling:

Pastor Schumacher talks about 'Our Mission and Ministry': "In October, 2013, we received the calls to serve in Ghana, West Africa. Upon completing our teaching duties in May, 2014, and securing the needed NSM funding, we were on our way to Ghana in August, 2014." Dr. Schumacher was called to serve as a Theological Educator at the Lutheran Theological Seminary, Ghana, where he teaches and serves as Academic Dean and Dean of Students. He was also asked to assist the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana with their Deaf Ministry. Through mentoring and teaching two Deaf Evangelists, the ELCG will have their first Deaf Pastors serving the many Deaf that live in Ghana. Cynthia was called part-time to serve as an English Language Teacher at the seminary. She provides instruction in vocabulary, grammar structure, and comprehension. Her teaching has had a tremendous positive impact on the student's theological education. The Schumachers have also worked with the students in establishing Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, which meets in the seminary building.

We Are Recreated in the Image of God by the Cross of Christ

Plotting against Jesus, the Pharisees attempted "to entangle him in his words" by asking about the payment of taxes to Caesar (Matt. 22:15). The Lord pointed to coins required for the tax, and He answered that we should "render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Matt. 22:21). But if coins bearing the image of Caesar should be rendered to him, then man — who is made in the image of God — must be rendered to the Lord. That tax is paid for us by the Lord Jesus, the image of God in the flesh, by His self-offering on the cross. And from His cross, as the Lord's anointed, He reigns as the true Caesar over all nations "from the rising of the sun and from the west" (Is. 45:6). The Lord once called and anointed Cyrus "to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings" (Is. 45:1). Now by the preaching of the Gospel, "in power and in the Holy Spirit" (1 Thess. 1:5), foreigners from all over the world are "turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God" (1 Thess. 1:9–10).
